We provide emergency food and clothing to families in need in the Greater Fredericton Area. In addition to our emergency services we facilitate volunteering (groups or individual) as well as educational tours with a focus on food security and sovereignty.

Teaching Kitchen

The Greener Kitchen is a forerunner in discussions about good food. Programming includes cooking classes for our centre members, public specialty workshops, catering, meeting space, and private group cooking classes.

Our Journey

The Fredericton Food Bank first opened its doors in 1983, becoming one of the first food charities in the Greater Fredericton Area. In 2012, the Fredericton Food Bank made the transition from a traditional food bank charity to a community food centre, the first of its kind in Atlantic Canada. Now called Greener Village Community Food Centre, our vision is to provide emergency access to high-quality food in a dignified setting that promotes choice and self-esteem.
